Most of the roads we ride are maintained and improved by Counties/Cities.
Most enforcement of laws that protect us is done by local police.
Local transportation planning and funding is key to improved safety and growth of cycling.

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BAHC Timeline



- November 2007 meeting of representatives of ~1000 cyclists from:
 - APL Cycling Club
 - Baltimore Bicycling Club 'Glenelg Gang'
 - Howard County Cycling Club
 - Mid Maryland Triathlon Club
- Decided to formally become an advocacy coalition as Bicycling Advocates Howard County (BAHC) in February 2008
 - Primary concerns/initial objectives <u>Safety and Visibility</u> of the Howard County bicycling community
 - Address ncreasing density of traffic on rural roads
 - Roads (design) unsafe for cyclists shoulders, intersections, lack of bike lanes, etc.
 - Improved communications with County Government
 - Improve PR with the community unintended consequence of event/cyclists proliferation
- Established a Bicycling Advisory Group (BAG) with County government in March 2009
- Incorporated in November 2009 and approved for 501(c)4 non-profit status in February 2010
- Bicycle Master Plan funded and developed June 2013 March 2014

Vision: BAHC Charter Precepts Support Cycling and the <u>Entire</u> Cycling Community



- Near-Term Objective: To improve the visibility and safety of the bicycling community in Howard County.
- Mid-Term Objective: To foster and support bicycle commuting as an alternative to automobiles within Howard County for both work and school transportation.
- Far-Term Objective: To promote a vision of bicycling as part of an energy efficient transportation system to help achieve a sustainable future for Howard County and the region.

Cyclists fall in several categories: health/exercise, racers/event competitors, commuters, and 'green'/environmental alternative transportation proponents.

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HC Bicycling Advisory Group

- In March 2009 commenced holding quarterly HC BAG meetings with County Government - to address longer-term issues and to educate representatives from:
 - County Executive's Office
 - County Council
 - Public Works
 - Planning and Zoning
 - Transportation
 - Recreation and Parks
 - Police
 - Columbia Association (governing body of Columbia)
- We have invited guests to support our goals/open dialogue from:
 - > MDOT
 - > SHA
 - Bike Maryland
 - Baltimore Metro Council

BAG provides a forum to address longer term issues and get immediate feedback

Accomplishments



- Electronic Community (listserve/web page/Facebook)
- Share the road signage (major bike/triathlon routes)
- Camera actuated stoplights (see bikes at intersections)
- Bike routes (let PW/Police know where we ride)
 - Partial Bike Lanes where feasible
- Training (hold Road Biking 101, e-mails, and worked with LBS and triathlon groups)
- Road Condition Surveys (used free 'survey monkey')
- Maintenance Priorities (worked to reduce chip and seal)
- Road Work Communication (e-mails on road issues)
- Events (group rides and local bicycle advocacy forum)

Cooperative Efforts



- County Executive/Council: Created and Lead Quarterly Bicycle Advisory Group meetings with representatives from HC Government, SHA, and Columbia Association
- PW: 'Share-the-Road' signs, re-striping/bike lanes, communications on road repairs and plans, road surveys/ critiques, and development of bicycle design guidelines
- P&Z/Transportation: Local B2W Day rally/routes, planning and zoning bicycle subject matter expertise, support/help to develop a County *Bicycle Master Plan*
- Rec & Parks/MORE: Mountain Bike Skills Park at Rockburn Branch Park opened in October 2012
- HC Police: Guidance on reporting incidents, conduct training on accident reports and enforcement
- SHA: Develop inter-County bike route to Fort Meade

Summary



- You can get local Government to work with you to support bicyclists' needs since:
 - bicyclists are a significant constituency/interest group;
 - we can provide alternative transportation expertise; and
 - potential benefits exist for local business, county quality of life/ PR, health, transportation, and environment from supporting bicycling
 - strive for accomplishments that matter to <u>both</u> cyclists and to local Government

 There needs to be an active group of participants and cooperation from local Government to be successful
It takes <u>commitment 4</u> – 20+ hours per month for leaders

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
